

Please be notified that regarding COVID-19 threat new safety rules were implemented by Polish Government as follows (announced on 24-03-2020):

Translation to English, below:

Until April 11 inclusive, you will not be able to move freely (not regarding to living, health and professional goals).

Therefore, the restrictions do not apply to:

- travel to work. If you are an employee, run your own business or farm, you have the right to travel to your work. You also have the right to go after purchasing the service and services offered by your professional activity.
- volunteering. If you work to fight coronavirus and help those in quarantine or in need who cannot leave your home, you can move around in this activity.
- dealing with the spread of everyday life. You will be able to move to shop, buy medicine, see a doctor, look after relatives and walk the dog.

Important! You can only move in a group of up to two people. (This restriction does not apply to families).

Travel:

As many people may travel as half of the seats on the bus present.

Public transport continues to operate. However, only half of the seats can be occupied on a bus, tram or subway. If the vehicle has 70 seats, there can be a maximum of 35 people on its board.

We want citizens to have access to communication. However, we must ensure that the buses are not overcrowded.

Total ban on gatherings - except with loved ones (family)

The new regulations also prohibit any gatherings, meetings, events or meetings. However, you will be able to meet your loved ones (family)

Safety rules during religious ceremonies

Restrictions on movement also do not apply to people who want to participate in religious events. Here, however, we have introduced another important principle. More than 5 people will not be able to participate in the mass or other religious rituals at the same time - excluding those who exercise the ministry.

However, we encourage you to participate in religious events via television, radio or the Internet.

Other restrictions still apply

Despite the changes introduced, all previous bans remain in force, i.e. restrictions on the operation of shopping malls, catering and entertainment activities.

A mandatory 14-day quarantine for those returning from abroad is also still in operation.
